Our Fall Barbecue had people popping balloons to reveal prizes generously donated by our local merchants. The food was great and everyone in attendance had a fun time. Unfortunately, we could have used more participants.

Without the support and generosity of our donors and the arduous work put in by our Board, we would not be able to accomplish our mission. Because of you, over the last 22 years, we have been able to help the women and girls of Ontario and Yates counties find their voices. 2023 GRANT PROGRAM NEWS

ONYA was able to award grants to five non-profit organizations for programs that will run in 2023 and help to foster personal growth and economic self-sufficiency among women and girls through-out Ontario and Yates Counties.



Child & Family Resources, Inc

"Mother and Child Emergency Need & Personal Growth Project"

This grant will allow for emergency need purchases, such as a phone card or gas card to assist families with daily needs. The funds may also cover larger high impact needs such as a college class for a Mom completing her degree, a car repair to enable transportation to work and for needed appointments for the children, a security deposit to secure a safe home.



Dress for Success Rochester

"Mobile Career Center Programming: DFS Express Ontario & Yates Expansion"

This grant will expand Dress for Success Rochester by helping to cover the costs of Mobile Career Center Programming at two locations in Ontario and Yates counties. The funded program offers employment and interview coaching, professional attire and styling points, soft skills, digital skills and employment retention support.



Family Hope Center

"Courageous Beauty"

This funded program is targeted and designed for girls 11-18 years of age and it addresses the concepts and topics that contribute to developing heightened self-esteem. Plans are to host 46 group meetings in which activities and lessons will lead to conversations about healthy relationships, sexual avoidance, and self-worth.

International Women's Day March 8th

International Women's Day is a global day celebrating the social, economic, cultural and political achievements of women. The day also marks a call to action for accelerating gender parity. Significant activity is witnessed worldwide as groups come together to celebrate women's achievements or rally for women's equality.

- celebrate women's achievements
- educate and raise awareness for women's equality
- call for positive change to advance women
- lobby for accelerated gender parity
- fundraise for **female-focused** charities



Dress For Success Rochester

Dress For Success was a successful ONYA grant recipient in 2022, and, in 2023, Dress For Success Mobile Unit, was awarded a grant to fund the program that will "come to us". Yes, this program will come into Ontario and Yates Counties to meet with our own local candidates who apply for access to their services.

So, what about Dress For Success?

Bivette Stodghill, Executive Director, Dress For Success Rochester, has some thoughts to share:

In 2015 a few good women opened the doors of Dress for Success Rochester at our downtown boutique. Fueled by the commitment of several local organizations, in under a decade, we have served more than 1000 women, providing professional attire, coaching, and computer skills.

Now more than ever, we believe every woman should have the tools and the opportunity to achieve financial independence and be successful in work and life. Several dozen community agencies partner with DFS Rochester to refer women to our customized services that address every phase of their careers. Women go from being unemployed and searching, to newly employed and adjusting to gainful employment, stability, and new directions.

I invite you to join us on our mission to inspire even more life changing transformations.

This organization certainly fits our grant criteria: to fund programs that give hands-on teaching and support to those who want to lift themselves out of their current situation and work towards a better tomorrow for themselves and their children.

As is customary, one of ONYA's volunteers recently made an onsite visit to this grant recipient. What follows are snippets of her experience:

When I arrived, I was met by Annette B., a volunteer coach, who explained their mission and how Dress for Success Rochester (DFSR) meets the needs of so many women.

Women are screened by an employment agency and bring their resume to DFSR. They then receive an interview outfit, including undergarments, jewelry to go with the clothing, makeup and hair updates.

While I was there, DFSR's new intern arrived for her first day of work. <u>I was privileged to</u> <u>see Dress for Success Rochester in action</u>. While she was in the dressing room, Annette went to the back room and brought her several tops and bottoms and dresses to try on.

Bivette and I watched as she came out of the dressing room, exclaiming how she liked the style and color of the new outfit. Bivette said, "That's what we call the 'aha' moment!" It was so exciting to see this young woman in new clothes which flattered her.

While providing clothes, Annette offered advice about the different pieces. While struggling with one of the outfits, Annette and Bivette both commented that her long fingernails would be a problem when working with future clients. These comments underscore how well DFSR works with all aspects of a woman's appearance with customers and future colleagues on the job.

ONYA is looking forward to the Dress for Success Rochester's Mobile Unit arrival in Ontario and Yates Counties and the support they will bring to our local women!
